

RESOLUTION NO. 2006-701

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

September 26, 2006

AGREEMENTS: TRUCKING SERVICES

BACKGROUND

- A. The Street Services Division of the Department of Transportation has an ongoing need for trucking services on many street repair jobs. This requires a number of contractors to cover busy times and occasional unavailability. The current three agreements expire October 6, 2006 with no option to extend.
- B. A formal bid for trucking services was opened by the City Clerk's office on August 23, 2006. Bids were weighted 80% for weekday/Saturday hourly rates, and 20% for Sunday/holiday hourly rates for both 3 axle dump and 5 axle transfer or semi-end dump trucks.
- C. Competitive bidding under the City Code allows award only to the one lowest bidder. Due to the need for multiple contractors, it is in the City's best interests to suspend competitive bidding, as allowed under the City Code, to permit agreements to be awarded to the three lowest responsive, responsible bidders: Tim A. Manley Trucking, Inc., Dillard Trucking, Inc. and Chavez Trucking. Contractors will be paid their hourly bid prices with work priority given to the lowest bidder(s). The total annual not to exceed amount for the three agreements is \$250,000, with a maximum contract term of five years.
- D. During the term of the agreements, if any of the contractors are unable to perform or if additional contractors are needed to provide these trucking services, City staff may request City Council approval for award of an agreement to the next lowest bidder(s) on the bid evaluation list.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. In the best interests of the City, competitive bidding is suspended for the purchase of trucking services.
- Section 2. The agreement specifications are approved and three agreements for trucking services are awarded to: Tim A. Manley Trucking, Inc., Dillard Trucking, Inc. and Chavez Trucking.
- Section 3. The City Manager is authorized to execute the agreements on behalf of the City in an amount not to exceed a total annual amount of \$250,000 for the three agreements. The City Manager may approve extensions of the

term(s) of the agreements(s) for up to four one-year extensions (for a maximum contract term of five years).


