Description/Analysis

Issue: Students attending classes at Sacramento City College (SCC) use the parking spaces in William Land Park on a regular basis. This has contributed to the traffic congestion, noise, litter, and air quality issues experienced by both residents in the area and park visitors. Also, the availability of parking for park visitors while the college is in session is limited. Concerns that students may not fully utilize the new Sacramento City College parking structure after it is completed in January 2007 and that they will continue to park on the streets in William Land Park make it necessary to extend the parking time limit from 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.–10:00 p.m. so as to include all times students are likely to park on the streets in William Land Park.

Policy Considerations: This recommendation is consistent with the City's strategic plan and the goal of the City Council to achieve sustainability and enhance livability.


Environmental Considerations: This project is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Class 1, Section 15301 (c) and Class 11, Section 15311 (a) of the CEQA guidelines. Projects exempted under Class 1, Section 15301 (c), consist of the operation, repair or minor


alterations of existing highways, streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails and similar facilities involving negligible or no expansion of use. Projects exempted under Class 11, Section 15311 (a), consist of the construction or replacement of minor structures accessory to existing commercial, industrial or institutional facilities, including but not limited to on-premise signs.

Rationale for Recommendation: On October 11, 2005 the City Council adopted a resolution to implement a two-hour parking time limit from 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m. on portions of streets in William Land Park beginning January 1, 2007. Extending the hours of the previously approved parking time limits from 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.–10:00 p.m. will address the concerns that the proposed parking time limits will not adequately control the problem of students parking on the streets in William Land Park. Parking time limits will be implemented in William Land Park on January 1, 2007 to coincide with the completion of the new Sacramento City College parking facility.

Financial Considerations: The cost to implement the recommended parking regulation is estimated to be under \$1,000. Funds are available in the Parking Services Division operating budget.



EXTENDING PARKING TIME LIMITS IN WILLIAM LAND PARK

BACKGROUND

- A. On October 11, 2005 the City Council adopted a resolution to implement a two-hour parking time limit from 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m., except Saturdays and Sundays, on portions of streets in William Land Park beginning January 1, 2007.
- B. In January 2007 a new parking facility will be completed for the Sacramento City College (SCC). The new parking time limits will be implemented to coincide with the completion of the SCC parking facility.
- C. Because of concerns that students may not fully utilize the new SCC parking facility, staff proposes extending the parking time limits from 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.–10:00 p.m. to include all the times that students are likely to park on the streets in William Land Park.
- D. City staff has been working closely with the District 4 Councilmember, SCC staff, Los Rios Community College District, Land Park Community Association, and Rescue Land Park staff in developing the changes in the hours of parking restrictions.
- E. No parking restrictions are being recommended for the areas around the Zoo or Fairytale Town at this time. Staff will monitor parking in these areas as well as the other areas of the park. If parking changes become necessary, a report with recommendations to address the issues will be brought to Council.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The parking time limits in William Land Park will be extended from 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.–10:00 p.m.





Section 1. The parking time limits in William Land Park will be extended from 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.–10:00 p.m.


