

RESOLUTION NO. 2006-800

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

October 31, 2006

DETERMINING THE RESULT OF THE SPECIAL MAILED-BALLOT ELECTION HELD ON OCTOBER 20, 2006, WITHIN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO NORTH NATOMAS NEIGHBORHOOD LANDSCAPING COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 99-02, ANNEXATION NO. 12

BACKGROUND:

- A. The City Clerk has duly canvassed the votes cast by the qualified electors within the City of Sacramento North Natomas Neighborhood Landscaping Community Facilities District No. 99-02, Annexation No. 12, (Annexation No. 12) at the special mailed-ballot election held within Annexation No. 12 on October 20, 2006, upon the proposition set forth below.
- B. The City Clerk has certified to the City Council the result of the votes cast at the special mailed-ballot election upon the proposition, and the certification is now on file in the City Clerk's office.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The statements in paragraphs A and B of the Background are accurate.

Section 2. At the special mailed-ballot election, the following proposition was submitted to the qualified voters of Annexation No. 12:

Measure (A): Shall the City of Sacramento North Natomas Neighborhood Landscaping Community Facilities District No. 99-02, Annexation No. 12, be authorized to finance landscape maintenance, more fully described in Exhibit A, and shall an appropriations limit in the amount of \$90,000 per fiscal year in connection therewith be established for the maximum rate and method of apportionment as provided in Resolution No. 2006-717 adopted by the City Council on October 3, 2006, which is incorporated herein by reference, and a tax be levied to pay for the maintenance of landscaping.

Section 3. The canvass of the votes cast at the special mailed-ballot election held in Annexation No. 12 on October 20, 2006, as shown by the City Clerk's certification, is approved and confirmed.

Section 4. The total number of votes cast for and against the proposition at the special mailed-ballot election in Annexation No. 12, as set forth in the canvass, is as follows:

Total Votes: 300

Votes For: 300

Votes Against: 0

Section 5. More than two-thirds (2/3) of all votes cast at the special mailed-ballot election were cast in favor of the proposition, and the proposition carried.

Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to enter this Resolution on the minutes of the City Council, and that entry will constitute the official declaration of the result of the special mailed-ballot election. The City Clerk is further authorized and directed to record a notice of Special-Tax lien in accordance with Streets and Highways Code section 3114.5.
