

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2006-811**

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

November 9, 2006

**AWARD THE CONTRACT TO THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE BIDDER FOR THE INITIAL PURCHASE OF FIVE DUMP TRUCKS, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$400,000 AND AUTHORIZE THE CITY MANAGER OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE A THREE YEAR CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF UP TO 15 DUMP TRUCKS WITH SACRAMENTO TRUCK CENTER WITH A TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1.2 MILLION.**

### **BACKGROUND**

- A. The Department of General Services has a current requirement for the purchase of dump trucks at \$80,000 each. Other City departments may also have a need to replace or purchase up to ten additional dump trucks; therefore, this bid has provisions to allow for those additional purchases at the current bid price, including cost escalation provisions (up to 5% per year) within the next three years.
- C. In August 2006 the City issued a formal invitation to bid, Bid No. B061181074 for five dump trucks. Three bidders responded. The lowest responsible bidder is Sacramento Truck Center.
- D. The City Council has adopted a policy of fuel strategies to improve air quality (Resolution 2005-454).

### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The contract is awarded to the Sacramento Truck Center for the initial purchase of five dump trucks, in an amount not to exceed \$400,000, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$1.2 million.
- Section 2. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute a three year contract with Sacramento Truck Center, 100 Opportunity Street, Sacramento, CA for up to fifteen dump trucks in an amount not to exceed \$1.2 million.


