Description/Analysis

Issue: The City of Sacramento Human Resources Department has utilized dial up modem access to DMV electronic drivers' license records since 1998. This MOU is required for conversion to an on-line application replacing the dial up system which required a dedicated computer and is not supported by current DMV technology.

Policy Considerations: Federal law requires employers to verify that every commercial driver hired has and maintains a valid drivers' license. Human Resources staff also verifies that City employment applicants certified for positions requiring non-commercial operation of vehicles for City business have valid California drivers' licenses. Drivers' license status is verified, on a case by case basis, for current employees as required to assure safety.

Permission to access drivers' license records is obtained from each individual via the application process or by requesting that a current employee complete a DMV Release of Driver Record Information form. A DMV release form is not required for monitoring the commercial drivers' license status of City employees

DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES, MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento Human Resources Department has utilized dial up modem access to DMV electronic drivers' license records since 1998. This MOU is required for conversion to an on-line application replacing the dial up system which required a dedicated computer and is not supported by current DMV technology.
- B. City staff that have direct or indirect access to drivers' license information are required to sign a DMV information security statement pledging appropriate use of the system and information confidentiality.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) granting Human Resources staff on-line access to verify drivers' license status of City employment applicants and City employees.
