**Impact on Tree Canopy by Mercy General Hospital and Sacred Heart Project**  
**Susan Brank**

Good evening, Council Members.

I have lived in the Mercy neighborhood for over 30 years, and I am a volunteer at Theodore Judah Elementary School. Tonight I would like to provide information about the impact of removing 138 mature trees to make room for the Mercy hospital and school projects.

This year the American Lung Association ranked Sacramento as the 12<sup>th</sup> worst city in the nation for air quality. We had 15 Spare the Air days last summer, and 79% of our days had moderate or unhealthy air quality.

The Mercy plan will take away one of the best weapons we have against bad air:  
**A mature canopy of trees.**

The trees targeted for removal are significant trees with a total diameter (DBH) of 1,194". The proposed replacement trees have a total diameter that is 80% smaller (240"). *(Some of the replacement trees are small, such as crape myrtles, date palms, and little gem magnolias.)*

I am concerned that the estimated number of trees to be cut down may be conservative. Mercy's arborist report states that a total of up to **424 trees may be adversely affected by the construction project** due to damage to roots, or other tree injury.

At the same time that Mercy plans to remove a huge tree canopy, they are also requesting a variance from the City's parking lot shade ordinance to plant fewer trees than required. I am not aware of any exceptions the City has granted under this ordinance, including the Arco Arena project. Trees help offset the heat and pollution that parking lots create. The City has established clear standards in its 2003 guidelines for "Parking Lot Tree Shading Design," and I would ask that the council enforce those standards for this project.

Some people may say, "Gee, we have plenty of trees in Sacramento." But the record shows that view is not supported by the City Council. Sacramento has adopted the important Greenprint plan to expand and protect our urban forest canopy. Also, in its General Plan, the City has embraced the concept of "extensive tree canopies" to help attain its goal of being the most livable city in America. Destruction of a big urban forest of nearly 140 trees would be a huge step backward.

Trees are not just an aesthetic “nice thing to do.” We can now quantify the impact on our air quality of the loss of these trees at Mercy thanks to recent studies by UC Davis for the Center for Urban Forest Research.

In one year, 138 trees remove the following amounts of pollution from the air:

- 7 tons of carbon dioxide, and
- 1,400 lbs of pollutants, including 560 lbs of ozone and 420 lbs of particulates.

It is a sad irony that a health care provider would willingly cause such a huge increase in pollution in a neighborhood.

I was gratified that Mercy has decided to modify the school design to save a rare 83-foot Bunya-Bunya tree. This modification came after two public hearings on the matter. Mercy had stated that there were absolutely no design alternatives to save the tree.

I would ask the City Council to pursue alternative design proposals with Mercy to save 138 trees in addition to the Bunya tree. **It is possible.** We have already seen two design alternatives tonight that would preserve the trees and residences, while also providing more green space. Isn't that what smart growth is supposed to encompass?

East Sacramento tops the region for the best tree canopy with 27% tree coverage. (*Berkeley National Laboratory*).

We ask that you help us preserve this livable community model.

**City Code Section 12.56.010 makes the case for preserving these 138 trees much more eloquently than I could. It states in part:**

**“The City Council finds and determines that the planting and preservation of trees enhances the natural scenic beauty, increases life-giving oxygen, promotes ecological balance, ..., improves the lifestyle of residents, and enhances the identity of the city.”**

The City of Sacramento and we as a community are committed to pursuing a smart growth strategy for the future, one that will also serve the goal of being the most liveable city in America. As we look to infill development and intensification of uses along transit corridors, we need to apply sensitive urban design to make sure those more intensive uses fit in the existing neighborhoods.

Although both the heart center and school buildings proposed by Mercy and Sacred Heart are architecturally handsome, and have obviously received a lot of design attention, it appears that the streetscapes have been ignored. The overall urban design of the project is lacking.

The most apparent example of poor urban design is that every street frontage of the hospital campus is a parking lot. While this might be appropriate in a suburban setting, it is inconsistent with the surrounding environment and with city's adopted Commercial Corridor Design Guidelines. The proposed exception to the parking lot shading requirement is neither explained nor justified in the project description. Bare parking lots don't contribute to a context-sensitive edge for the project.

The other painful design feature of this project is the six-foot iron fence surrounding the school on the 39<sup>th</sup> Street and H Street frontages. The available landscape plans are not detailed, but it appears that this fence will abut the back of the sidewalk. This is a very unfriendly gesture to the neighborhood and its contribution to school security is unclear, since there are no building or campus entrances secured by the fence. It would serve to make the existing curb-adjacent sidewalk even more inhospitable. If the fence is absolutely necessary, it should be set back from the sidewalk by at least three feet.

This project should pay particular attention to 39<sup>th</sup> Street between H and J Streets because:

- This street segment will experience the greatest incremental increase in traffic resulting from this project
- It is an important bike and pedestrian corridor (as recognized in the Pedestrian Master Plan)
- It is the only signalized crossing of H Street for 10 blocks (over half a mile) in either direction, presenting the only opportunity for kids, the elderly, and the timid to cross this highly trafficked street on foot or on bike
- It is a vital link between the school and Sacred Heart church, one of the stated objectives of the project
- Crossing 39<sup>th</sup> Street will be required to access off-site parking for the school

- Schools and hospitals are recognized as pedestrian nodes and need special accommodations
- Alternate forms of transportation are key to managing the traffic impact of the project, and bicycles and pedestrians
- Existing sidewalks, crosswalks, and bicycle accommodations are inadequate and unsafe, including utility pole encroachments, offset crosswalks, and conflicts with autos
- Mercy will control the entire frontage (but for one lot) on the east side, and the school project will result in redevelopment of over half the frontage on the west side of the block.

Attached are some very specific suggestions for how 39<sup>th</sup> Street could be made into a great street that is more bicycle and pedestrian friendly street, provides an appropriate frontage for the proposed project, and softens the neighborhood impact of the project. I hope that you will consider these as conditions of approval. We deserve to have a project that brings great urban design along with the hospital and school improvements.

Here are a few design suggestions that could go a long way to lessening the impact of this project, improving its fit in the neighborhood, and making 39<sup>th</sup> Street a great pedestrian street:

- Require utility undergrounding along the east side of 39<sup>th</sup> Street
- Require frontage improvements to current design standards – a 6' wide sidewalk separated from the street by a landscape strip
- Eliminate the fence around SHPS, or at least require it to be set back from the sidewalk by a minimum of 3 feet
- Don't grant the exception to parking lot shading requirements
- Widen and flatten the sidewalks, and add pedestrian refuges and amenities along the street
- Reduce the curb radii at the 39<sup>th</sup> and J intersection to improve the pedestrian landings at both the northeast and northwest corners
- Employ traffic calming measures along the street to assure that the on-street parking restrictions don't result in speeding
- Add pedestrian level lighting
- Widen the curb cut at the southwest corner of 39<sup>th</sup>/H to make it easier to navigate

Re: Mercy General Hospital and Sacred Heart Parish School Mixed Use Project (P04-215)

To the Mayor and Councilmembers:

I do not support the Mercy General Hospital and Sacred Heart Parish School Mixed Use Project (P04-215). Instead, I support the alternate Campus Alternative, which would develop the Heart Center at either the Methodist Hospital (a CHW campus) in south Sacramento or at Mercy Hospital in Folsom. Both locations can accommodate a heart center. This alternative would not result in the demolition of any residences or the relocation of Sacred Heart School and would not negatively impact the neighborhood adjacent to Mercy General Hospital.

The current proposal would destroy irreplaceable charming homes near Mercy and displace people who do not want to leave. How many people here would give up their homes for a school? I'll bet all those people who want to tear down these houses wouldn't give up their homes.

The plan is to replace established one-of-a-kind homes with condominiums. Condominiums are a great way to make money aren't they? People who say smart growth just want to make money – they are the ones who make the most money from redevelopment. They want to make as much money as they can off of the least amount of land as possible.

It is not necessary to move Sacred Heart School. There is plenty of room at the current location. If the school were moved across the street it would affect Mercy McMahon Terrace, an assisted living facility which is not cheap. Parking for residents and visitors would be taken by the school. Noise from bells, screaming and yelling students at recess, P.E., lunchtime, after-school activities, and sports activities and weekend activities would

affect elderly and poor of health residents of Mercy McMahan. Furthermore, years of construction noise, dust, diesel fumes, etc. would negatively affect the health of people at Mercy McMahan.

The plan calls for the destruction of 139 trees, which presently provide a canopy and improve air quality. Mercy also wants a variance to allow them to plant less trees than required. This is unacceptable.

Fifteen years from now, it is likely that this hospital will want to expand again, eating away at more homes in East Sacramento. If we keep letting this type of expansion occur, we are going to lose much of a great neighborhood. Please do not approve this project. Thank you.

#### **Aesthetics and Visual Resources**

The DEIR has not adequately analyzed the potentially significant aesthetic and visual impacts of the project on the residential character of the surrounding neighborhood. With the subject proposal, Mercy has removed 33 single family homes over the past fifty years to accommodate its expansions. By doing so, Mercy has changed the neighborhood character of the surrounding area for many blocks. Additionally, the proposal to allow the Heart Center to exceed current height restrictions is out of character with the surrounding one and two-story, single-family neighborhood homes. These impacts were not adequately addressed in the DEIR.

#### **Air Quality**

The DEIR addressed construction diesel toxic air contaminants (TAC) generally, but did not fully analyze these potential impacts and asserted, as a justification for this failure, that there is no regulatory criteria for assessing significance.

The absence of a significance threshold does not provide a legal basis for refusing to analyze a potentially significant impact. (See the discussion below regarding global warming). Furthermore, since it is not disputed that construction equipment will emit TAC, and the project will be in close proximity to several sensitive receptors (including schools and the hospital) every effort should be made to identify and reduce these impacts to the

greatest degree possible. After-market filters are available for construction equipment which could reduce particulates -- and therefore TAC -- significantly.

Similarly, global warming is discussed but summarily dismissed based upon the lack of a threshold and a conclusory statement that this project, standing alone, might not have a significant impact.

The absence of a threshold does not justify the failure to analyze potentially significant impacts. To the contrary, the City has the discretion to determine, based on a variety of factors, whether impacts are significant.<sup>1</sup> Neither CEQA, the Guidelines, nor the courts have required the adoption of thresholds as a prerequisite to analyzing impacts. To the contrary, significance criteria are commonly developed by the experts that prepare the CEQA analysis, based on their assessment of the technical evidence.<sup>2</sup>

There is no question that this project will generate additional CO<sub>2</sub> emissions. And while a full analysis may show that the global warming impacts of the project will not be individually significant, those same emissions may well be cumulatively significant. And, again, mitigation to reduce climate change emissions impact is readily available and should be applied to the project.

The analysis of operational air quality impacts is also flawed. The DEIR conclusion that these impacts will be less than significant is based upon the assumption that traffic levels will be similar to those of a standard hospital; in this case, however, the project includes a Heart Center that will generate significant additional trips due to the number of out-patient procedures that will be undertaken. Comments on the Notice of Preparation asked that other similar facilities be analyzed to accurately determine the true trip generation rate for this type of facility. Unfortunately, because this was not done, the DEIR air quality analysis is not supported by substantial evidence and is deficient. We therefore believe that the traffic impact analysis and the air quality analysis need to be revisited.

### **Transportation and Circulation**

As indicated in the above paragraph, MENA believes that the use of incorrect trip generation assumptions has caused the DEIR to underestimate the traffic impacts. The analysis is also flawed because the DEIR ignored key significance criteria.

The DEIR utilizes the City's level of service (LOS) categories to determine whether increased traffic will have a significant impact. Under this limited approach, an impact would be significant if:

1. *The traffic generated by a project degrades peak period level of service from A,B or C (without project) to D, E or F (with project); or*
2. *The LOS (without project) is D,E or F and the project generated traffic increases the peak period average vehicle delay by five seconds or more.*

While this analysis is a necessary step in determining significance, it does not go far enough. CEQA requires that impacts be analyzed even if an impact meets an adopted standard, if circumstances indicate the project may nonetheless have a significant impact.<sup>3</sup> The City can not rely on the LOS guidelines in a manner that precludes consideration of other evidence that the impact might be significant.<sup>4</sup> In this case, the traffic levels exceed the objectives stated in the City's General Plan, which provides an effective measure of significance and demonstrates that the project will have a significant impact on transportation and circulation.

For example, 39<sup>th</sup> Street, which is classified as a local street, already has traffic volumes that exceed 4000 vehicles per day and these traffic levels will increase if the project is approved. These levels are inconsistent with the City's General Plan, which states that:

*"Local streets are not intended to move through traffic. Volumes on residential local streets will typically be 2,000 or fewer vehicles per day but could be as high as 4,000 vehicles per day."*

With the additional traffic added by the project, 39<sup>th</sup> Street levels will exceed the maximum level contemplated by the General Plan. Even the 4000 level set in the plan is too high. Donald Appleyard, in his seminal research work on residential street livability, concluded in *Livable Streets*<sup>5</sup> that the maximum livability capacity for residential streets is 3000 vehicles per day and that 2000 vehicles per day was the threshold above which residential livability was significantly impaired. While J Street and H Street are classified as arterials, they are residential streets as well and their livability is being greatly impaired by vehicle volumes of 19,638 and 17,805 vehicles per day respectively. Exiting driveways has become extremely hazardous and pedestrian and bicycle travel has become more dangerous. 39<sup>th</sup> Street, as mentioned above, is classified as a local street

and its traffic volumes certainly exceed the livability threshold. While higher traffic volumes than 2,000 to 3,000 vehicles per day may be appropriate in areas with higher density residential development and mixed uses, it is not appropriate in areas that are primarily single family residential in character.


In addition, the City's emphasis on traffic circulation ignores the fact that beyond simply moving traffic, urban streets often function as public spaces where people walk, ride bikes, meet and socialize with others. By considering traffic circulation alone, only one function of a street is being considered and the livability of the street for residents of this community is completely ignored.

Given the inadequate traffic significance thresholds utilized for this analysis, one cannot reasonably conclude that cumulative traffic impacts are less than significant.

In conclusion, this is not the first instance where MENA has commented on the inadequacy of a traffic analysis for a new project. Each new project as it goes through the City's environmental review process is considered to be less than significant because it does not excessively impact intersection levels of service. Meanwhile, the livability of our streets in East Sacramento continues to be degraded. Many of us chose to live in East Sacramento because of its livable, walkable, bikeable and safe streets. The qualities we so desire are being eroded by the City's lack of an adequate threshold of significance for traffic impacts.

We sincerely look forward to working with you to establish appropriate traffic thresholds of significance, reanalyze the impacts of this project and apply needed mitigation. We also look forward to working with you to develop a comprehensive mobility plan for East Sacramento, which we have requested numerous times in the past.
