

RESOLUTION NO. 2005-748

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

ACCEPTING A HABITAT CONSERVATION PROGRAM GRANT FOR RIPARIAN IMPROVEMENTS AT ORCHARD PARK (PN: LK73) AND APPROPRIATING \$75,000 IN PLANNING AREA 9 PARK DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES (FUND 791) AS THE REQUIRED MATCH

BACKGROUND

- A. The Habitat Conservation Program (HCP) provides funds to local agencies for the acquisition, enhancement, restoration and/or interpretation of riparian habitat, wetlands and other wildlife areas.
- B. With City Council support, the Department of Parks and Recreation prepared a HCP Grant proposal in October 2004. The grant funds would be used riparian improvements along the Natomas Main Drain at Orchard Park.
- C. The City of Sacramento was notified in the September 2005 that the proposed grant project would be fully funded.
- D. The HCP program will fund at most 50% of the total project budget as proposed in the grant application. A \$75,000 request requires a \$75,000 match, making the total project budget for the grant proposal \$150,000.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Habitat Conservation Program grant in the amount of \$75,000 is accepted into Fund 248.
- Section 2. The Habitat Conservation Program grant in the amount of \$75,000 (Fund 248) is appropriated to the Orchard Park Phase II capital improvement project (PN: LK73).
- Section 3. \$75,000 in Planning Area 9 Park Development Impact Fees (Fund 791) are appropriated to the Orchard Park Phase II capital improvement project (PN: LK73) as the required match.


