



Subject: Community Racial Profiling Commission Quarterly Report
(October - December 2005)

The Community Racial Profiling Commission (CRPC), established in November 2004, has now completed its first year. It has been this Commission's steadfast goal to provide the City with a greater opportunity to be inclusive and allow for equitable representation and accountability. This 4th quarterly report enumerates the activities of the CRPC from October through December 2005.

Commission Membership

The following table comprises the current status of Commission membership. Due to board openings and term expirations, several member changes and re-confirmations have occurred. Four seats are currently under review or awaiting confirmation (Districts 1, 2, 4 and 6). Jerry Enomoto continues to serve as the interim representative of the Office of Public Safety Accountability.

Quarterly Report Process

In order to be fully involved in the process of reporting to City Council, the Commission voted to have staff prepare draft quarterly reports on Commission letterhead for review and approval by the Commission. To promote an open information process, it was also decided that finalized reports will be submitted through the City Council agenda as informational items. This is the first report to be provided in this manner.

Traffic Stop Data Analysis Consultant

Since the Commission's decision in September to recommend Lamberth Consulting for the completion of the Traffic Stop Data Analysis project, staff has completed contract negotiations with Lamberth Consulting. Staff is preparing to seek City Council approval of the Lamberth contract in February. It is planned for work to begin on the study as soon as the contract is approved.

CRPC Website

The Commission voted to initiate a CRPC website to be linked from the City of Sacramento's homepage. This website would make information about the Commission's activities and the City's racial profiling study more accessible to the public. Commission staff will work with City staff to create the website in the coming months.

Goals

The Community Racial Profiling Commission is looking forward to a productive year. Goals include beginning work on and monitoring of the Traffic Stop Data Analysis project, and further development of a workplan.
