

RESOLUTION NO. 2006-232

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

April 4, 2006

AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPLY FOR GRANT FUNDING FOR THE PURCHASE OF A FIRE STATION ALERTING SYSTEM IN THE AMOUNT OF \$511,500

BACKGROUND

- A. The essential component within each fire station for receiving dispatch alerts and incident information is the Fire Station Alerting System.
- B. The current fire alerting system, installed fifteen years ago, was designed using custom-built, proprietary components that have become unreliable, obsolete and are deteriorating.
- C. The Fire Department is seeking grant funding to replace the current system with a commercially available and supportable system to provide a more reliable and functional notification system.
- D. On March 6, 2006, the Office for Domestic Preparedness opened the application period for the *Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program*. Applications are due by April 7, 2006.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Manager or his designee is authorized to apply for grant funding for the purchase of a Fire Station Alerting System in the amount of \$511,500.
