

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2006-249**

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

April 18, 2006

### **APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO AND APPLIANCE DISTRIBUTION, INC., TO PROVIDE FOR THE PICK UP, PROCESSING AND PROPER DISPOSAL OF UNIVERSAL WASTE (HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES) PURSUANT TO THE UNIVERSAL WASTE COLLECTION REGULATIONS CONTAINED IN THE CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS, TITLE 22.**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A) Effective February 9, 2006, the California Code of Regulations, Title 22, Division 4.5, Chapter 23 prohibited the disposal of Universal Waste (Household Appliances) with mercury switches in landfills.
- B) Said regulations cited above will require trained, certified technicians to process and handle appliances with mercury switches to insure the proper removal and disposal of the mercury and compressed oils found in the household appliances.
- C) Appliance Distribution, Inc. is a local vendor located in the City of Sacramento currently providing this service and is certified pursuant to the Universal Regulations described in Title 22 of the California Code of Regulations to handle and process household appliances containing mercury.
- D) Appliance Distribution, Inc. has been providing this same service to the City of Sacramento since February 9, 2006.

#### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. The City Council approves the agreement described in Exhibit 1, between the City of Sacramento and Appliance Distribution, Inc. to provide for the proper handling and processing of household appliances disposed of by residents of the City of Sacramento, and authorize the City Manager to execute the Agreement.


