Background: The Committee has only 3 remaining meetings to complete its work toward providing final recommendations to the City Council:

1. June 20
2. June 27
3. July 6 (Wednesday)

Council Direction to the Committee

On April 12, 2011, the City Council approved Resolution 2011-203, which established the Sacramento Redistricting Citizens Advisory Committee (SRCAC). The Resolution defines the purpose, composition, selection, and timeframe of the SRCAC.

- The SRCAC shall be an advisory body to the City Council. The SRCAC is established for the purpose of reviewing council district boundary change proposals ("redistricting proposals"); organizing, analyzing, and refining redistricting proposals; and recommending to the City Council redistricting proposals.
- The SRCAC is charged to review, organize, analyze, and refine, as necessary, redistricting proposals submitted to the City. The SRCAC may, if it chooses, prepare its own redistricting proposal.
- To present a written report in final form to the City Council which shall:
 - Summarize the redistricting proposals submitted
 - Organize the redistricting proposals as the SRCAC determines appropriate for consideration by the Council

- Recommend for Council's consideration one or more preferred redistricting proposals
- Provide such other suggestions and recommendations that the SRCAC determines appropriate to facilitate Council's redistricting process and decisions.

Steps in the Process

In order to accomplish its charge, the following steps need to be accomplished by the Committee:

1. Committee member ranking of the top 5 and bottom 5 from the 15 maps still under active consideration following the June 13th decision to eliminate 14 maps;
2. Based upon the composite ranking of the 15 maps, Committee decisions about which 3-5 maps to move forward
3. Committee direction regarding optimum refinements / modifications to the 3-5 maps.
4. Committee selection of 3 maps to provide to the City Council.

Staff Recommended Timetable

June 20 Committee Meeting: Committee narrows the field to 3-5 maps for further consideration.

June 21 – June 27 Homework: Committee members provide to staff any proposed refinements to the 3-5 maps

June 27 Committee Meeting: Committee formulates direction to staff regarding a package of modifications to the 3-5 maps.

June 30: Staff provides staff report analyzing the feasibility and implications of the refinements.

July 6 Committee Meeting: Committee formulates final recommendations for 3 maps to be provided to the City Council.

July 12 Council Meeting: The Committee's final recommendations will be presented at the Council's July 12th meeting. (All 37 original maps will also be available to the City Council.)
